5. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Reports from Working Groups

The Camellia Festival on Feb. 20-22 was a success. Members marched in the parade, initiated a temporary "Walk Temple City" wayfinding signage campaign, and hosted a booth at the Camellia Festival on Saturday to promote alternative transportation and share bike/ped safety information. The "Little Libraries" Project committee has postponed their first meeting to March 7 due to scheduling conflicts.

The General Plan Working Group has been in contact with staff, and helped schedule the General Plan presentation tonight.

6. PRESENTATION

A. Introduction to the General Plan
The City's Planning Manager Reimers introduced consultant
Ms. Aho from PlaceWorks, who is working on the City's
General Plan. Ms. Aho gave an overview of the General Plan, its
purpose, and the community involvement process. Committee
members present then broke out into a mapping exercise to
identify various development goals for different parts of the
city.

7. UPDATES FROM STAFF

Management Analyst Chung informed the Committee that the City applied for two awards with the California Association of Public Information Officials—one for Rosemead Boulevard (which Committee members assisted in with the Grand Opening Festival), and another for the Youth Engage Conference. Notification is pending.

For the upcoming Youth Committee update to City Council, Management Analyst Chung recommended that the Camellia Festival Working Group deliver a brief presentation on recent progress and updates. The update will take place on April 21 at 7:30 p.m.—just in time for Youth Committee recruitment.

8. REPORTS FROM COUNCIL AND COMMISSION LIAISONS

- A. City Council

 Mayor Pro Tem Chavez was absent.
- B. Parks & Recreation Commission Committee Member Mok attended the February 18 Parks & Recreation Commission Meeting, which was also the transportation meeting where Dial-A-Ride users gave input on the new transportation provider. TCUSD also requested to use Temple City Park for the Annual Health Fair.
- C. Planning Commission No update. Members were unable to attend.

- D. Public Arts Commission Committee Member Trinh reported that the Public Arts Commission is discussing whether or not the City should have standards for public art plaques, but it was decided that plaques should be fabricated on a case-by-case basis. The Council also approved a \$29k contract with muralist Art Mortimor to conduct a "Mural in a Weekend" project, likely to take place in summer.
- E. Transportation & Public Safety Commission Committee Members Dodge and Weisz reported that recent Transportation & Public Safety Commission meetings involved more parking citation appeals.

9. ITEMS SEPARATE FROM THE REGULAR AGENDA

Committee Member Lee stated that at the Camellia Festival, Mayor Pro Tem Chavez invited the Committee to attend the Council Reorganization Ceremony on March 17.
